Student Guide Level 3 BTEC National Award

What is the Level 3 BTEC National Award in Media Production (Television and Film)?

The qualification will give you an understanding of the practical skills and knowledge needed to begin professional work in the media production industry, with a specific focus on television and film. You will gain insight into the employment opportunities available, enabling you to choose your career, progress within your existing field, or to plan moving on to further study.

The course is designed to be adaptable to your abilities and needs. There are two core units, one mandatory specialist unit plus a choice of three specialist units (totalling 360 guided learning hours). The structure of the course allows you to focus on your interests or introduce yourself to new areas, for example: multi-camera techniques, writing for television and video, film studies or music video production. Please note that the units studied may vary to meet local or learner needs.

Where will this qualification take me?

Employment opportunities

With the international recognition of BTEC courses such as this, you can progress straight into employment. Successful candidates can go on to explore various positions, all of which will benefit from your studies, for example: TV/film, media research, advertising or other creative roles.

Further vocational and academic qualifications

The BTEC National Award in Media Production (Television and Film) has the equivalence of one GCE A Level, and it is possible for you to progress further into higher education, as successful BTEC National qualifications give UCAS points for university applications.

How long will it take me to complete this qualification?

The length of the course is largely dependant on the centre. Normally, it will take one academic year to complete but it may be studied for longer.

What are the entry requirements?

The entry requirements for the Edexcel Level 3 BTEC National Award in Media Production (Television and Film) are laid down by individual centres. Fundamentally you should have a broad education including, for example, a BTEC First in Media and/or four GCSEs (graded C or above) and, in addition, the interest and potential to succeed in achieving the qualification.
