



Media Production (Television and Film)

Student Guide Level 3 BTEC National Certificate

What is the Level 3 BTEC National Certificate in Media Production (Television and Film)?

The qualification enables you to start building a range of technical skills and knowledge, focussing mainly on those associated with television and film, which will help you begin working professionally in media production. You will gain insight into the career opportunities available in the media industry, enabling you to make an informed choice regarding career progression or moving on to further study.

The course is designed to be adaptable to your abilities and career aspirations: it consists of four core units, a mandatory specialist unit, plus a choice of specialist units (totalling 720 guided learning hours). The structure of the course allows you to focus on the areas which interest you the most, such as film studies, presentation techniques for broadcasting or single camera techniques. Please note that the units studied may vary to meet local or learner needs.

Where will this qualification take me?

Employment opportunities

With the international recognition of BTEC courses such as this, you can progress straight into employment. If successful there are a variety of potential careers that you can explore, all of which will benefit from your studies, for example: TV/film editor, TV/film camera operator or broadcast journalist.

Further vocational and academic qualifications

The BTEC National Certificate in Media Production (Television and Film) has the equivalence of two GCE A Levels, and it is possible for you to progress further into higher education, as successful BTEC National qualifications give UCAS points for university applications.

How long will it take me to complete this qualification?

The length of the course is dependant on the centre. Normally, it will take two academic years to complete but it can be studied for longer.

What are the entry requirements?

The entry requirements for the Edexcel Level 3 BTEC National Certificate in Media Production (Television and Film) are laid down by individual centres. Fundamentally you should have a broad education including, for example, a BTEC First in Media and/or four GCSEs (graded C or above) and, in addition, the interest and potential to succeed in achieving the qualification.
