Candidate attempts to spell common words but spelling is very inaccurate so that the meaning is compromised. Handwriting may be illegible.	No evidence of ability to spell or write consistent with the standard.
<b>TASK</b>	<b>3 marks</b>	<b>2 marks</b>	<b>1 mark</b>	<b>0 marks</b>
<b>A or B</b>	A candidate should only be awarded 3 marks when a full, error free response, consistent with the level has been produced	A candidate should be awarded 2 marks when the task is largely complete with minor mistakes that do not affect overall clarity.	A candidate should be awarded 1 mark where a recognisable attempt at to meet the requirements of the task has been made but where many mistakes impede clarity.
