GCSE English Pilot - Cash-in training

Question and Answer Session

<p>Q: What happens to pupils who have not completed a full set of modules to be cashed in? Will they be awarded a 1/2?</p>	<p>A: No - pupils can only be awarded qualifications where they have completed all the required units. In this case, learners may be eligible to claim a short course or, if they have been studying for a double award, a single award GCSE.</p>
<p>Q: I have already entered my Cash In codes as my pupils are all taking units for 2731. I thought that this was the only way that they would get their grades on results day. Should I have done this or not?</p>	<p>A: You are right in that cash-in codes must be submitted in advance to receive grades on results day. As your learners are studying for the English single award, there is no advantage in cashing-in late as they have to complete Units 1 & 2.</p>
<p>Q: How do we go about entering the pre results cash in June as we will not have the results of unit 7 then?</p>	<p>A: You have a choice - you can either cash-in now on the basis of estimated results or wait until results day and use actual results.</p>
<p>Q: What session do we use to cash in on results day?</p>	<p>A: Summer (June) 2009</p>
